This brings the total number of Squilometres in **Devon to five!** We feel truly blessed and can't wait to see how Anna and the Littleham community choose to explore and celebrate their place.

The Great Conjunction 2020

On 21st December Jupiter and Saturn will appear to us to be the closest they have been in the sky since 1623! They will both be visible in the same field of view of a small telescope. You need to look South West, very close to the horizon just after sunset.

We're very pleased to be working in collaboration with the University of Exeter Astrophysics Outreach team, the Exeter Science Centre, and Interwoven Associate Artists Boo to a Goose Theatre to be providing input for local schools in our Squilometre communities to co-incide with the Jupiter/Saturn Conjunction.

"Weaver Bees" - Learning and participation

We're developing Interwoven participation all the time and you can explore all of the different options and routeways for yourself, through the Participation Framework.

However, we've come to realise that our Squilometre Place Champions – "Weaver Bees" as we are coming to affectionately know them - are

in fact Super-Participants.

They're not volunteers in the usual sense. They are active agents, not only in their own communities but also within Interwoven's

horizontal structure. They are self-managers and have decision-making power to influence the Squilometre technique.

Importantly, they can also become "Weaver Bee" Trainers, which is a paid role. As creatives in their own right they can network with the growing community of Associate Artists seeking ways to develop new projects and create income through their creative practice.

More than this, they receive £5000 worth of National Lottery Heritage Funded training and support in heritage interpretation and community facilitation. Interestingly, we've recently had talks with the University of Plymouth around accrediting the course at Masters or PgDip Level.

We think that's entirely appropriate and sets the right level for just how extraordinary these individuals are. They may join us as volunteers with a passion for community CONNECTION but once Interwoven, they're and incredibly important part of the organizational whole.
